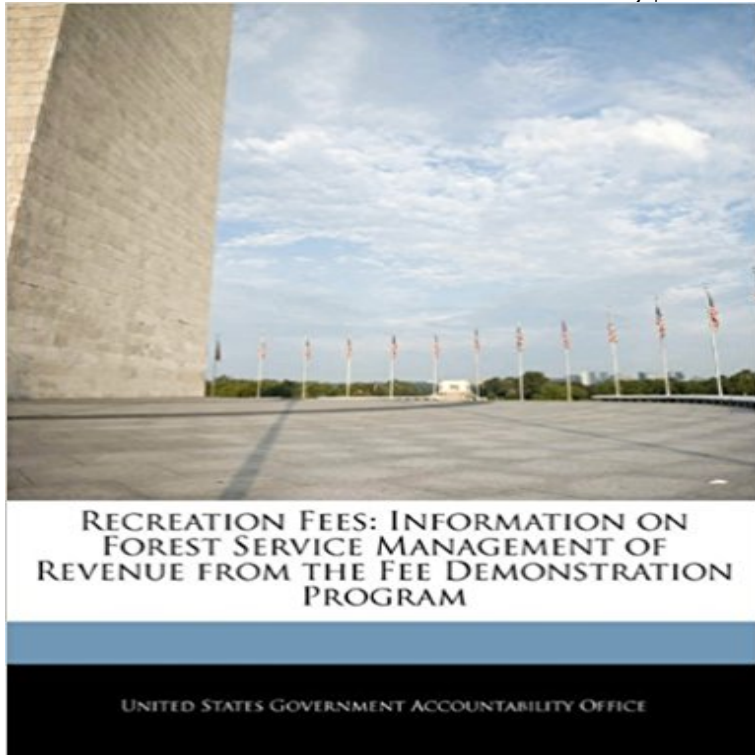


Recreation Fees: Information on Forest Service Management of Revenue from the Fee Demonstration Program
