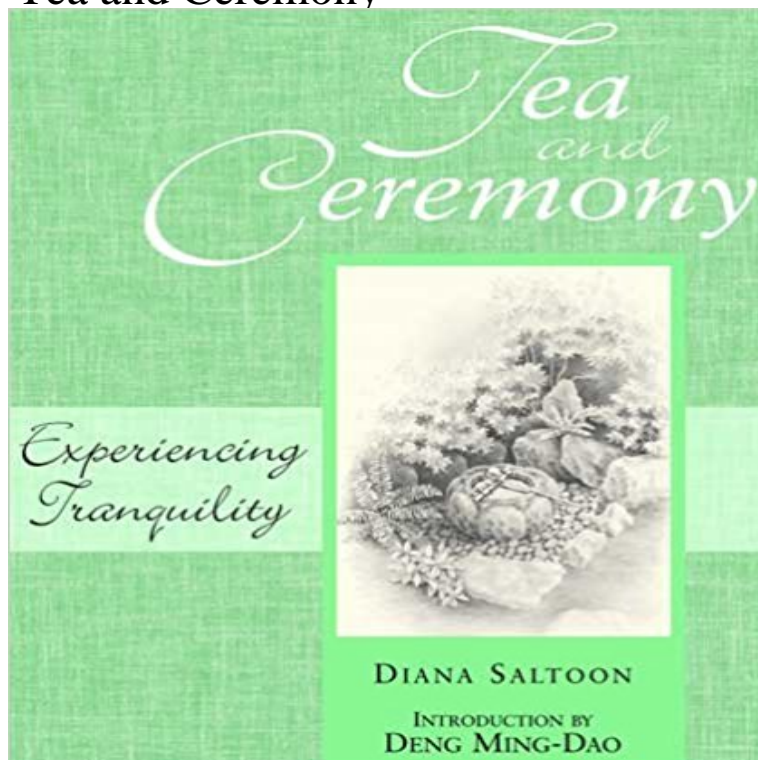


Tea and Ceremony
