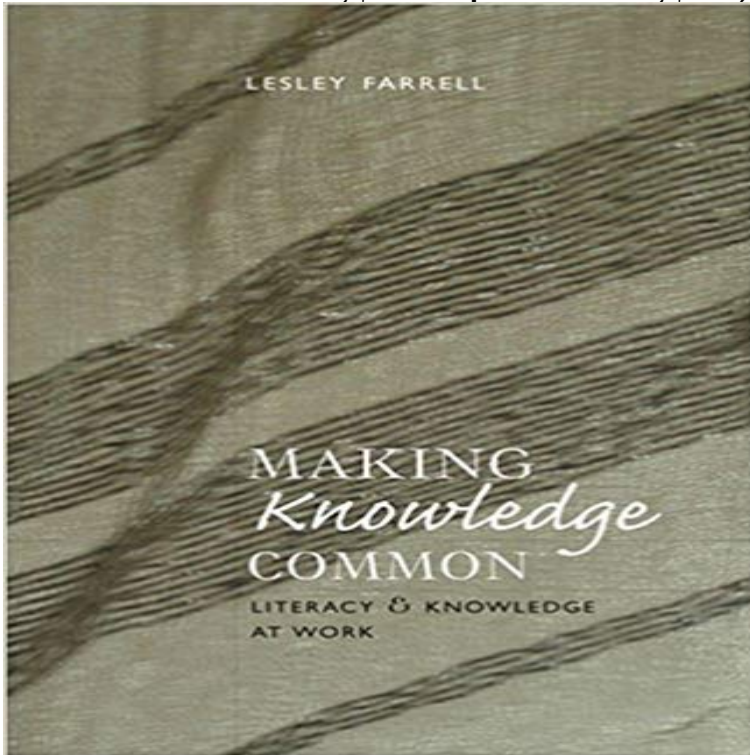


Making Knowledge Common: Literacy and Knowledge at Work (New Literacies and Digital Epistemologies)
