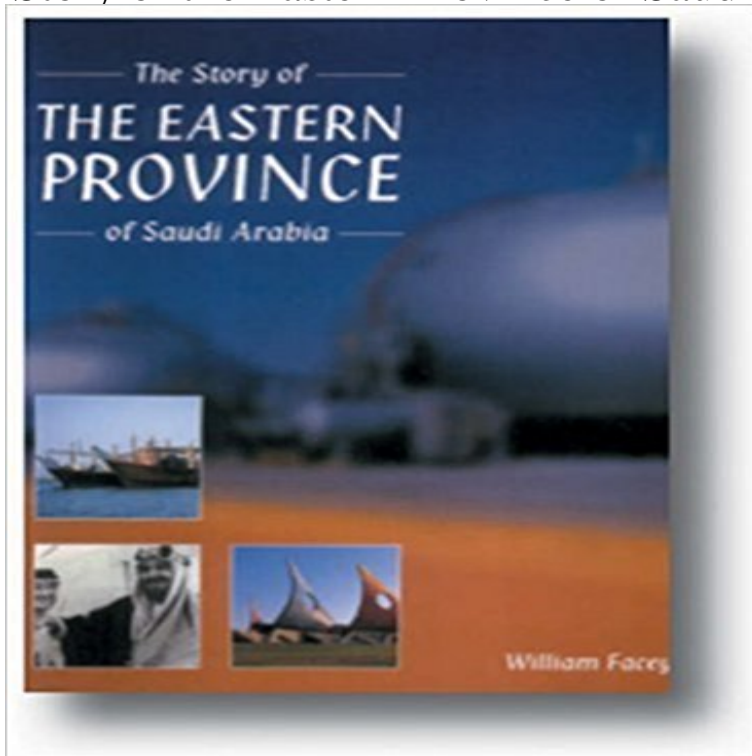


## Story of the Eastern Province of Saudi Arabia
