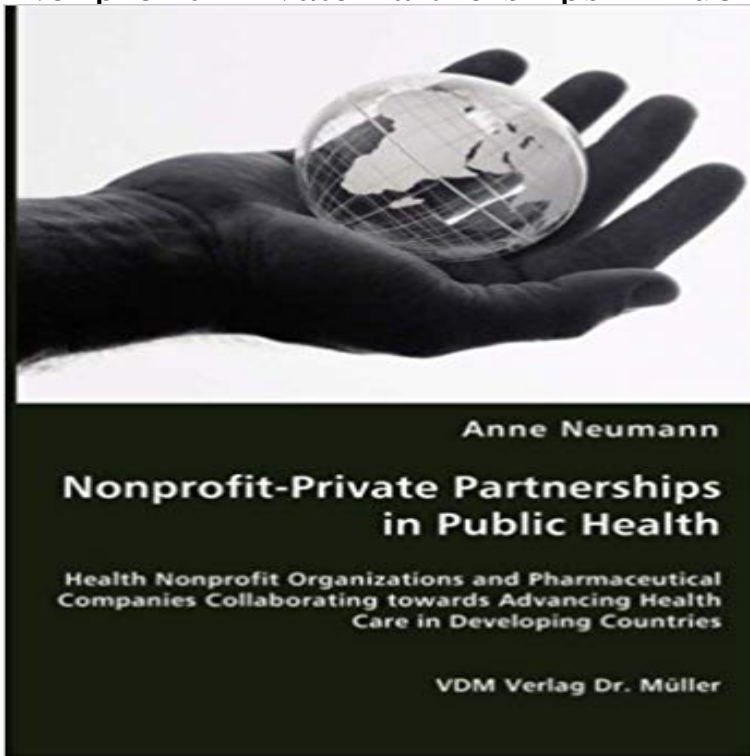


## Nonprofit-Private Partnerships in Public Health
