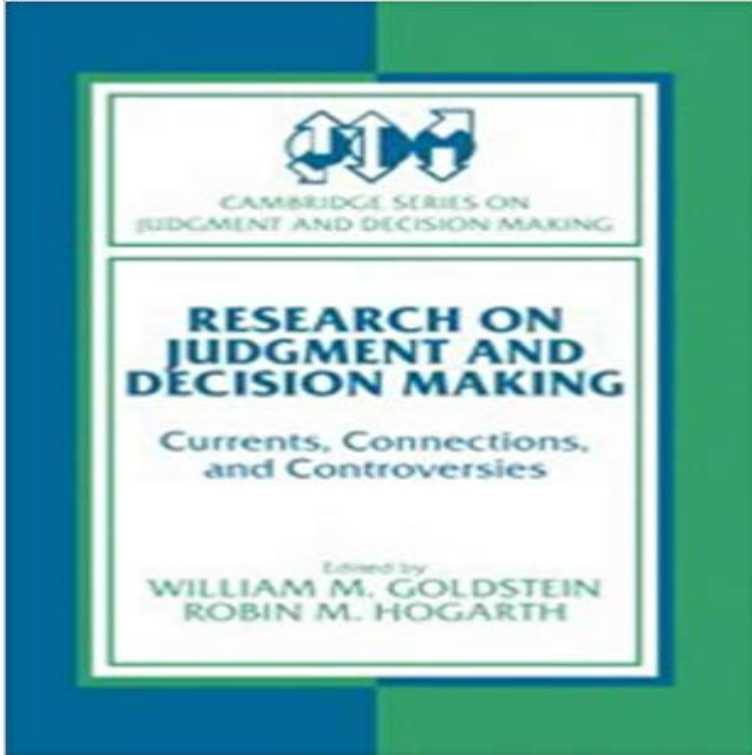


Research on Judgment and Decision Making: Currents, Connections, and Controversies (Cambridge Series on Judgment and Decision Making)

Finally, a section on controversies presents problem representation, domain knowledge, content specificity, rule-governed versus rule-described behavior, and proposals for radical departures and new beginnings in the field. Students and researchers in psychology who have an interest in cognitive processes will find this text to be rewarding reading.
