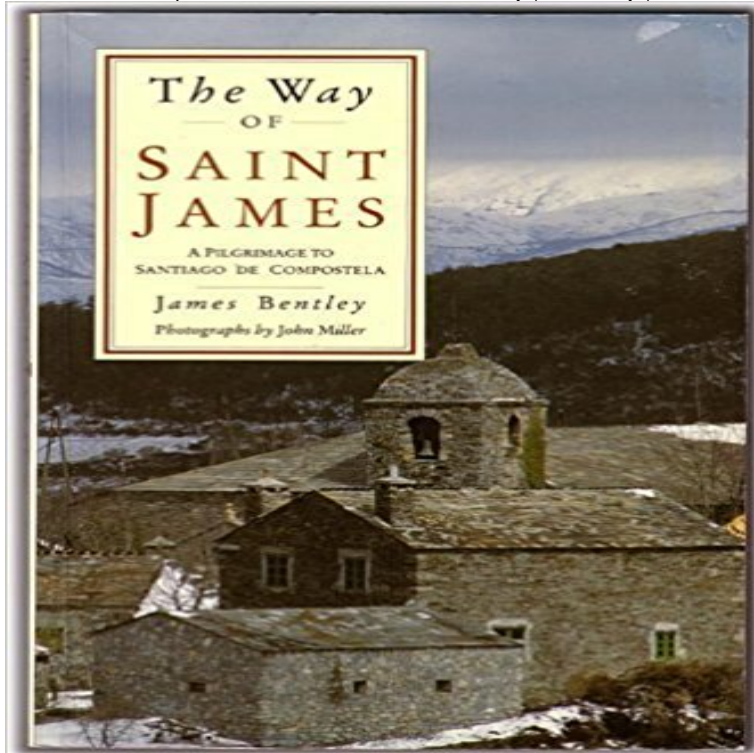


The Way of St. James: Pilgrimage to Santiago de Compostela
